Tullock Creek Dam Iroject

A latter dated 6/14/36, signed by six farmers in the vicinity of Big Horn, requested the construction of a stock water and irrigation reservoir on Tullock Creek in Treasure County. The site of the proposed dan is located about 15 miles from the mouth of the creek. The dam would be 60 feet high having a crest length of 1,800 feet and would impound sufficient water to irrigate 1,600 acres. The water released from the reservoir would flow down the channel of Tullock Creek to the lands to be irrigated. Diversion works and necessary ditches would be built by the farmers.

The State Engineer and a representative of the W. P. A. visited the proposed site during the year 1936. They estimated the dam would store 2,500 nore feet of water. The project was considered too large an undertaking for the W. P. A.

A letter from George Miller, Engineer for the State Water Conservation Board, dated 2/10/39, indicates that a new location for the dam was located in NEt of SW1 of Section 8, Township 1 south, Range 36 east. The new location is on the Crow Indian Reservation. On 2/21/39, the State Nater Conservation Board wrote the Indian Service relative to the construction of the dam on the Reservation. No additional information is available.

Hysham Irrigation Project 129

The Hysham Irrigation district is located in Treasure County, Adjacent to the county seat, Hysham, and it includes the lends situated in T 6N, B 3D, 36, and 37E. The total irrigable land in the district is approximately 6,000 seres and is located on the south side of the Yellowstone diver. It extends from the reilrand station at Hyers on the Morthern Pacific Endered, nearly due east for about nine miles. The maximum width of the treat is elective miles. The water supply is from the Yellowstone River.

The district was erected February 11, 1915, at which time extensive surveys of the district were made. An engineering report was submitted February 14, 1914, recommending irrigation of the lands by pumping. The proposed pumping plant was to be operated by steam. The construction was not undertaken at this time.

During the period from 1914 to 1925, three other engineering investigate ions wore made of the project.

In 1925 Mr. B. C. Lillis, Consulting Engineer, of Billings, investigated the project and recommended a plan of irrigation by pumping from the Yellowntene River, just east of Myers. The proposal, as submitted by Mr. Lillis, would include the installation of pumping units to supply water to two supply canals, known as the lower canal, having a capacity of 68 subjected per second, and an upper canal, having a capacity of 20 subjected per second. The pumping equipment would be contributed pumps, directly connected to electrical meters. The electrical power would be secured from the Montana Power Commony transmitted line, which runs within 40 miss of the project. The lower canal would be 12 miles in length, and would irrigate 5,000 acres of land. The upper canal would be six miles long and would irrigate 1,400 acres.

hr. Millis' plan included the following items of construction:

Installation of pumping equipment

Construction of 18 miles of supply dans 1.

Construction of two siphons

Construction of 40 miles of transmitton line

Construction of necessary laterals, turnouts, etc.

Total construction costs, including everhead and engineering, as estimated by Mr. Lillis, amounted to \$220.670. A new bond patition asking the authority of the District Court to issue \$300,000 worth of bonds was made. The stigated annual charge included power, operating, and maintainence, was figured at \$4.56 per more for the first five years, the charge for the sixth year would amount to \$5.92, after which the annual c arge would decrease \$0.065 per core per year. Maintainance and operating charges after liquidantion of the bonds was estimated at \$2.87 per core.

The project was approved by the State Engineering Office during September, 1925.

The project was never built and in July, 1935, Mr. H. J. Stoutenburg, Commissioner of the District wrote to the State Ingineer requesting that the project be considered in connection with the proposed Federal Tublic Works Program. There is no further information in the Water Board files to indicate the present status of the project.

The project extends east from Dyshan to about north of the town of Sanders on the Yellowstone River. It was organized as the North Sanders Irrigation District to take over the North Sanders cooperative Ditch Companies Works, and extend and enlarge the same to cover 5,400 scree of irrigable land. 3,500 acres were irrigated by gravity flow from this river in addition to 1,900 screen irrigated by two pumping installations which pump directly from the canal. The project operated successfully for several years with ample water supply. Owing to the lowering of the river channel, the present intake system can divert water only Juring the high water period.

August 17, 1955, an application was submitted to the Public Works Administration requesting a losn and great for the construction of the following:

Construct a submarged rock-filled timbered low diversion dom ac oss the Yellowstone River, with flash boards to raise the river level two feet at low mater.

Clean main capal.

Construct invert siphon at Froze to Death Greek.

Install two new pumps and motors for the irrigation of the land above the canal.

Total cost including overhead and right-of-way, as astimated by the State Water Conservation Board, August, 1935, amounted to \$52,787.

The project failed to receive a Public Works Administration allottment - No additional information available to indicate whether or not the project was built.

Sarpy Creek Project 619

About October or November, 1938, a petition was filed with the State Water Conservation Board requesting that a survey and investigation be made relative to the feasibility and cost of building a dam to impound the waters of Sarpy Creek, located in the NEt of Section 4, Township 3 north, Range 37 east, and the NW4 of Section 16, Township 2 north, Range 37 east.

At present this project is still pending.

Engineers report dated April 30, 1940, gives the following: That this project is located in Section 25, Township 1 north, Range 38 east. Proposal is to build a dam on Sarpy Creek 20 feet high, creat length 650 feet. This dam would impound 600 acre feet of water. It is proposed to fill this reservoir to hold the spring run-off, and release this water for irrigation when most needed.

The cost estimated by Fred E. Buck is: Total Cost - \$17,385.00

Cost per acre foot - 31.14

The drainage area of Sarpy Creek above the dam site is 32 square miles. From the estimated storage, about 2,000 acres could be irrigated from this supply.

Big Horn Tullock Creek Project 144

This project is located along the south side of the Yellowstone liver immediately below the mouth of the Big Horn River. The town of Big Horn is in the heart of the irrigable area. This project was originally built as a State Irrigation District in 1919. In 1921 the diversion dam washed out. The next year a pumping plant was installed about one mile down the river to pump water into the canal, but due to the excessive operation and maintenance cost of inadequate machinery, this enterprise was soon abandoned and the project has not operated since.

The construction features consist of a gravity canal and diversion dam across the Big Horn River. Rehabilitation of the project consists of cleaning out the canal which will be 53,000 feet long and have a carrying capacity of 50 second feet; replacing the inverted siphon across Tullook Creek and building a new diversion dam. The total length of the dam will be 210 feet and the maximum height above the natural stream bed will be approximately 8 feet. Construction of the dam and the headworks is nearly completed and rehabilitation of the canal should be completed early in the spring of 1941.

Big Horn-Tullock Project 144

The project will contain about 1300 net acres of land under the present canal. It is planned to install, at some future time, a small low lift pumping unit to pump water from the canal to irrigate about 700 additional acres.

The Big Horn-Tullock Water User's Association, a Montana corporation, requested the Board to advance it the cost of materials and supplies necessary to construct the dam above mentioned and to rehabilitate the existing canal in a sum not to exceed \$32,000, this sum being the estimated cost thereof, as made by the State Nater Conservation Board.

To secure the funds to be advanced, the Big Horn Tullock Water User's Association entered into a Water Marketing Contract with the Board, whereby they agreed to repay this loan in annual installments over a period of 35 years, beginning December 16, 1941.

In order to provide the Association with the funds to meet this obligation, the Association has entered into Water Purchase Contracts with individual water users in the aggregate amount of 1,300 miner's inches at the rate of \$1.00 per miner's inch for the period 1941 to 1946, inclusive, and \$1.50 per miner's inch for the period 1947 to 1977, inclusive.

General Description: The irrigation system consists of a main canal 9 miles in length diverting water by gravity, flows from the Big Horn river. A low dam is required at the head gate to insure water in the canal at low water. Structures consist of concrete main canal head-gate and wasteway. A concrete inverted siphon across Tullock Creek and concrete turnouts to all laterals.

The project was originally started January 2, History of Project: 1902 as a private ditch taking water out of In 1919 the Big Horn-Tullock Irrigation Disthe Big Horn River. trict was organized and the ditch was extended up the river to include a larger area of land 1697 acres of which 1300 acres are classified as first class irrigable land. The project operated successfully and good crops were produced up to the spring of 1921 when the high water washed out the diversion dem. In 1922, a second hand engine and pump outfit was installed but never operated successfully. Without an adequate supply of water the landowners were unable to pay their assessments and in 1928, they lost their land by tax deeds. At the present time the county owns about 1000 acres of the irrigable land.

There are 24 farms in the district and about 70 people living on the project many of whom are on relief. \$75,000 worth of bonds and \$22.487 of warrant indebtedness are outstanding. A bond and warrant holders committee has been formed and has agreed to accept settlement at 13%.

The Big Horn-Tullock Irrigation District and landowners have requested and agreed to quit-claim water rights and title to the irrigation system to the State Water Conservation Board including release from the bond-holders on the Irrigation system. The revenues derived from the sale of water to be pledged for the repayment of the loan.

Elevations: The elevation of the irrigable lands above sea level is 2700 feet.

Climate: The last killing frost in the spring occurs about May 1 and the first killing frost in the fall, September 15, making an average frost free period of 136 days. The climate is sufficiently moderate to permit the growing of beans and sugar beets. Annual precipitation averages 14 inches, a large part of which falls during the growing season. The mean temperature during the past three years was ‡ 47.6°, high 106.3°, low 32.3°.

Land Topography: The topography for the most part is gentle sloping bottom lands, which lie along the east side of the Big Horn River below the rim rocks. The lands are favorable for irrigation.

Soils: The soils are largely silty loam in character, very fertile and productive. The lands are graded as 80% which constitutes the highest grade in the county.

Crops: The principal crops grown are alfalfa hay, grains, sugar beets, beans and garden truck. Alfalfa produces three cuttings, about 3 tons per acre, beets 13 tons per acre, beans 15 cwt.

The project should maintain 500 acres of beets and 700 acres of alfalfa. The Billings sugar beet factory is 60 miles west, a favorable shipping distance.

Water Supply: In 1909 the Big Horn-Tullock Ditch Company appropriated $62\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet of water, which has been duly transferred to the Big Horn-Tullock Irrigation District. This is one of the oldest rights, and there are no adverse suits or litigation pending affecting this water right. The water supply in the Big Horn River is adequate the entire season.

Drainage: No drainage difficulties were experienced during the irrigation of these lands, and none is contemplated with proper irrigation methods.



ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of BIG HORN PROJECT, INCORPORATED

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned, Guy L. Bradbrook, D. M. Manning and Ed Verhelst, all citizens of the United States, and residents of Treasure County, Montana, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Montana.

ı.

That the name of the Corporation shall be Big Horn Project, Inc.

II

That the purpose for which it is formed are:

- 1. To carry on a general farming and ranching business, to conduct the general business of cultivating and improving farms and agricultural lands and livestock raising.
- 2. To purchase, own, lease or otherwise lawfully acquire, hold, use, farm, cultivate, operate, improve, encumber, lease, deal in, sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of, farm and grazing lands, crops, feed agricultural commodities and real and personal property of every kind, nature and description.
- 3. To appropriate water for irrigation and other beneficial uses, and to construct, maintain, extend and enlarge irrigation ditches and canals, and to purchase, own, control, use and operate the same, and to own, sell, supply and deal in irrigation water and water rights for irrigation, domestic and other useful and beneficial purposes and for such other legitimate and proper uses and purposes as are necessary to the encouragement of agriculture and horticulture.
- 4. To lease or otherwise acquire and dispose of any lands believed to contain petroleum, oil or gas, and to prospect for, drill, pump, pipe, store, refine and sell oil, gas and petroleum products and to construct any and all buildings, pipe lines, pumping stations, and storage tanks, and any and all other buildings and structures required in carrying on the business of said company.
- 5. To take over and acquire by purchase, exchange or other lawful modes, and to own, vote and sell and otherwise dispose of the capital stock and bonds of any other corporation.
- 6. To borrow money on notes, bonds or debentures with or without security and to mortgage, pledge or otherwise encumber all or any portion of the property or assets of the corporation, and to secure the payment thereof by mortgaging or otherwise pledging all or any of its property, and to assume and undertake the performance of obligations of every kind and character incurred by this or by any other corporation or individual.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, the undersigned, pursuant to and in conformity with the provisions of Chapters 12 to 23, Civil Code, Revised Codes of Montana, 1935, and Acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto, associate ourselves together, not for profit, and do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

The corporate name of this Corporation is hereby declared to be

Big Horn-Tullock Water Users' Association.

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes for which this Corporation is formed are as follows:

1. To appropriate, purchase, market, sell, pump, divert,

develop, furnish, distribute, lease, and dispose of the waters of the Big Horn River and Tributaries, which will be diverted from said stream by a dam, diversion works and canal located in the $\mathbb{N}^1_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of the $\mathbb{SE}^1_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of Section 10, Twp. 4 North, R. 34 E., and such other structures as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of the Association and the diversion of water from the Big Horn River and its tributaries of the aforesaid stream, and from all other available sources of supply, together with the return flow of all of the foregoing waters furnished or supplied by seeping or over-flowing from the previous place of use of such waters and the waters from other dams, reservoirs, diversion canals, distributing canals, laterals, ditches, pumping units, mains, pipe lines and water works systems; said waters to be used for irrigating lands adjacent to and below said dams, reservoirs, laterals and canals and for other useful and beneficial purposes.

- 2. To enter into and carry out agreements with the State of Montana, the State Water Conservation Board, the United States of America, or any instrumentality or agency thereof, or any person, firm, association, corporation, private, public or municipal, with reference to the purchasing, marketing, furnishing, distributing and selling of the aforesaid waters, and to the privilege of obtaining such waters when available; and the diversion, development, disposition, and utilization of such waters; the charging, collecting and disposition of rents and revenues for such waters and privileges; the operation, maintenance, repair, alteration, construction, reconstruction, and supervision of the means of conserving and distributing such waters.
- 3. To construct, reconstruct, maintain, repair, alter, use, control and operate dams, reservoirs, irrigation works and systems, drainage works and systems, diversion canals, distributing canals, lateral datches, pumping ditches, pumping units, mains, pipe lines, waterworks systems, and other means of conserving and distributing the aforesaid waters.
- 4. To lease, sell, or otherwise dispose of water, water rights, lands, easements and/or property which it may acquire.
- 5. To acquire, own, and hold such real and personal property as may be necessary or convenient for the transaction of its business.
- 6. To incur indebtedness upon its bonds, notes, contracts, or other evidences of indebtedness, and to secure the same by mortgages, deeds of trust, pledges of any or all of its revenues and contracts, or in any other manner subject, however, to the approval of any such indebtedness by resolution of the State Water Conservation Board.

- 7. To acquire, hold, and dispose of stock in other corporations, domestic or foreign.
- 8. To acquire by purchase, forfeiture, or in any other legal manner, shares of the Capital Stock of this Corporation, and to acquire and exercise options thereon, and to dispose of, re-issue, or cancel same as the Board of Directors may determine.
- 9. To have and exercise all the powers, and to perform any and all acts necessary, convenient, or appropriate, to carry out any one or more of the said purposes or anything incident thereto, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Association or its shareholders, and to that end to enter into any contract, agreement, or other arrangement with the State of Montana, the State Water Conservation Board, the United States of America, or any instrumentality or agency thereof, or any person, firm, association, corporation, private, public or municipal, or any state or foreign government.
- 10. To make and promulgate By-Laws for the government and control of this Corporation. The By-Laws, or amendments thereto, adopted by the Board of Directors shall be, and become, effective only after their approval by the State Water Conservation Board.
- ll. The powers herein granted and conferred shall be exercised only with the approval of the State Water Conservation Board.
